Otherwise, bills are always due on or before the  $20^{th}$  of each month to avoid late fees. Please call our office for more details at (304) 789-6996 or visit alpuc.com under the Forms tab on our website and print out the customer ACH form that describes the terms and also has the application that we will need to sign you up for this free service. You can also make your payment at the ALPUC Office; After Hours Drop Box located at the office; or by mail.

Just a reminder – if you wish to have your water turned back on/off at the street, please contact ALPUC by email or letter requesting when you want service restored/disconnected. This service will be offered Monday through Friday during regular business hours. BUSINESS OFFICE NEWS – by Linette Sines, Business Manager

Watch your mailbox for the 2014/15 Assessment billing, which should arrive around May 1<sup>st</sup>. Remember that ALPOA has contracted with BB&T to more efficiently process assessment payments. When you receive your assessment bill in May, it will come directly from BB&T. A remittance stub will be provided, and it will be VERY important that you return your remittance stub with your payment to ensure the proper account receives credit. *Checks will still be made payable to ALPOA*. All payments must be remitted to BB&T, P.O Box 628207, Orlando, FL 32862, or at any BB&T Financial Center. If you use an online bill pay provider, use the bill pay account number only – do not add any other letters, numbers or identifying words in the account number area. The bill pay number is unique to each property address and payment obligation. If you own more than one property, or if you have more than one payment obligation, you may have different bill pay numbers for each payment. You can also make your payment online via credit card or e-check by simply going to <a href="https://www.bB&T.com/payments">www.bB&T.com/payments</a> and select "Pay Now". Additional fees will apply for this option.

Assessment bills bill be mailed out on or about April 30, 2014. <u>They will be due by May 16<sup>th</sup></u> afterward, they will be considered late. You must make payment (full, half year or first quarter) by this date. **Payments for assessments will no longer be accepted at the lodge.** Owners will still have the option to make quarterly and semi-annual payments, if preferred. Please remember that any correspondence should still be mailed directly to the lodge (i.e., address changes, billing questions, auto/boat registration information, etc.) – ALPOA – Property Owner Accounts, 700 W. Alpine Drive, Terra Alta, WV 26764. Payments for 2014/15 **Boat Stickers** (\$42.40/boat – tax included) will still be accepted at the lodge beginning May 1, 2014. This year, boat stickers will be distributed by the Front Desk Staff, so if you are a weekender, you will be able to pick up your sticker the same day you pay for it at the Front Desk.

#### **ECC COMMITTEE** – by John Laing, Chair

The question often comes up whether or not a permit is needed for work on a particular driveway. If you are filling in specific holes, the answer is no permit is required. If you are paving or laying down a new layer of gravel over the whole driveway, a permit is required. Many existing driveways interface with the roadway in a way that causes drainage or plowing problems. If a driveway is going to be redone, or a new driveway is being installed, the Alpine Lake maintenance folks want to insure that the finished driveway will not adversely affect snow plowing. This requires a meeting between AL Maintenance and the person doing the driveway work before start of the work. The permit process involves several steps. First, ECC checks to insure driveway does not cross lot boundaries or infringe on easements. If passed by the ECC, the permit request goes to AL Maintenance, which arranges with the person listed as doing the work for a meeting. At that meeting, AL Maintenance explains what the requirements are for culverts and interface with AL roads. Once an understanding is reached on how work must be done, AL Maintenance will provide a copy of the approved permit. Once work is completed, AL Maintenance will inspect the driveway and, if OK, will notify the ECC that the work is done. Driveways should be graded and ditched, so that gravel from the driveway does not wash onto the roadway.
