A week ago a longhaired black male kitten was dumped in the woods behind the home of Cathy and Paul Schleupner on Grosbeak Drive. The kitten was starving and wet from all the rain we were having at the time. Cathy saw him out there and brought him to me and she was kind enough to pay his vet bill. This is something most people do not do for me. THANK YOU CATHY. The kitten was named "Stormy" and is doing well at our shelter/sanctuary in town.

Two days after the arrival of Stormy, the daughter of Gloria Beahm on Wood Lily Rd found a tiny female in the woods near her home that was in the process of giving birth! Kristen was kind enough to take her in until she had to return to PA. Now I have this sweet calico mommy who is just a kitten herself, and she has five tiny little kittens. THANK YOU Gloria and Kristen who helped with food, litter and \$\$.

Just about everyone at Alpine Lake knows I love cats, but I am now 81 years old and my husband is 92, and we I can no longer do this rescue work. I've even bought a building in Terra Alta to house all these homeless cats, but I am NOT a one-woman animal shelter, and I get no funding. I pay for everything myself. Feeding 40 cats and having them spayed or neutered and vetted is very expensive, but when I do you a favor by picking up a cat, very few of you offer to help me with \$\$ or cat food.

I am desperately trying to find homes for these cats and kittens before we depart this earth. The five kittens will not be ready for adoptions yet, but you can see them now, and I will keep one for you until they are old enough to leave their mother.

PLEASE HELP ME FIND HOMES, but unless you are willing to help me please don't call and tell me about cats or kittens that are dropped off in your yard. I cannot take in more cats, and it only upsets me to hear about it. Unfortunately Alpine Lake Resort seems to be a dumping ground for unwanted animals. If you can help, call me at 789-6710.

#### ECC COMMITTEE - by Dick Gallagher, Chair

PERMITS, PERMITS... This is a reminder that almost anything you do on the outside of your home requires a permit. This includes painting and staining, even if it's the same color. In the past, some projects were done that were not approved and would not be deemed acceptable today. We encourage all homeowners to have a fifteen-foot area around the home cleared of trees, as recommended by the fire association of Colorado. The permits will be approved and are no fee, but they still must be filed to comply with the Declaration of Restrictions.

The Declaration gives the ECC 30 days to respond to requests. With the exception of Driveway Permits, we are responding the day we receive them at our meeting. When we notify you, usually by phone, that the permit has been approved, **You Must Pick Up the Permit** at the front desk **BEFORE** you begin work. The permits should be displayed where they can be seen from the road (a front window works best). We have received calls from property owners asking if we know that work is being done on a property. We then have to either go back to the office or contact the owner to determine whether the work has been approved. Since permits are approved for a period of one year, you can see where this is a time-wasting process. JUST PICK UP AND DISPLAY THE PERMIT! Thanks.

I can see why we would not want boats to be launched from the Boathouse/Boatyard areas but I don't see why people can't fish from the shore elsewhere or from boats launched from elsewhere. The way it reads you can use the lake for boating but not for fishing. Having a sign that said no boat launching for any reason from the Boathouse area is what we need. I have asked for clarification but so far haven't gotten any. Some of the musicians will be disappointed as some band members fish between performances.

Does anyone know what happened to summer? We have had a nice fall so far, well in advance of fall's actual start. Maybe August will be really hot. Who knows, certainly not the weatherman. I'm not complaining and the lower temps have not seemed to dampen the enthusiasm of the folks who have come up here from hotter regions. They love the coolness.

**President's Report,** *submitted by Ginger Tucker, President BOD ALPOA*The ALPOA Board is continuing to pursue back assessment collection through our collection attorney.

We continue to see increased customers in the restaurant and everyone realizes that consistency in service is our biggest issue. We are striving to train our wait staff and I believe we have seen some small improvements. Is it enough, soon enough, remains to be seen!

If you haven't noticed the FWIW is now available for all patrons to review. We had a nice turnout at the 18 July Board Workshop meeting in support of open access by everyone to this community paper. Loring Young submitted a petition signed by 148 property owners signifying their desire to have the paper in the open. Buddy Turner, ALPOA attorney, provided a legal review of the Jun 27 FWIW issue and submitted a legal disclaimer which said primarily the same thing that George Evans reported in the 18 July FWIW issue.

The BOD received a complaint regarding storage capability for an Alpine Lake community group at the Boathouse. The BOD recognizes that storage at the boathouse is at a premium and were open to suggestions for alternatives. Dennis Schiffbauer suggested building low wall cabinets in the corner along the wall where the current movable bar sits. Dave Tucker and Dennis will measure and determine cost and building material requirements.

John Laing and Mike Carroll volunteered to update the Alpine Lake Property Owners Handbook. The updates required include the changes submitted by the Lake Management Committee and the ECC during the June Annual membership meeting.

If you haven't seen the digital sign near the Walmart in Oakland please take the opportunity to drive by as Lauren Kotula, our Marketing Director designed the Alpine Lake ads that are appearing on both sides of the sign leaving and coming into Oakland.

Mr. Hipple of Maple Court addressed concerns about stray dogs entering Alpine Lake from Alpine Lake Rd through his property. The BOD has discussed this issue with our attorney who is addressing it from the legal perspective initially with an informative letter to the offending Alpine Lake Rd resident. The BOD also discussed locating barriers such as boulders or metal cable gates on perimeter properties. The BOD and GM will investigate further.

The BOD approved Dave Gearhart as a new member of the ECC and Dick Gallagher as the ECC Chairman.

The BOD discussed the dumpster fence and the issues with daily trash pickup. The gate on the fence will be repaired and strengthened and trash will be picked up daily per the GM.

Tom Kinsey thanked John Shepherd for the new signs for the boat storage area.
