Happy New Year! We hope to make 2015 an improvement year for Alpine Lake with better restaurant management (a new restaurant manager) and amenity changes (new pool). The Board has approved the contractor to build the new security building and golf cart barn with the contract finalization by next week with construction to begin as soon as possible (given the unpredictability of January Terra Alta weather).

You may have noticed the work around the lower grounds of the lodge. This is a staging area for the pool construction. The contractors needed the area established before inclement weather to better preserve the grounds for spring/summer rehabilitation. The pool rehab is moving forward, and the Board will soon institute a Pool Ad hoc Committee to establish pool policies.

Since we have limited winter restaurant hours and staff, we are installing a hospitality center in the Mountain Laurel dining room to benefit our motel guests and lodge winter activity participants. Dave Tucker and Frank (our new lodge maintenance man) are completing the installation. The center will have coffee/tea/cocoa and light breakfast fare to be paid for at the front desk.

Our staff perform a service for us and deserve our respect at all times. They have reported incidents where patrons have insulted, spoken rudely or acted inappropriately towards them. The staff is authorized to tell the offending patron to leave the premises and will call Security for assistance, if required.
