<u>Solar Panels:</u> Homeowners who wish to install solar panels should submit detailed plans to the ECC to obtain a permit. As a general guideline, panels that are incorporated into the house structure, such as placement on the roof, would probably be approved provided the color(s) associated with the installation are consistent with the existing house colors in the community. Stand-alone panels, those that would be detached from the house and placed on the lot, would not be approved. Please do not undertake the installation of panels without submitting detailed plans to the ECC and receiving a permit.

Winter has arrived with all its beauty and cold (brrrr!). The biggest storm of the season (or that is the hype) is headed our way this weekend so be sure to be prepared.

Mini-golf rebuild is still open for suggestions. The GM and President of the board met with Vince from Maverick Contracting (they did the front sidewalks) last week and he presented some good ideas. Mike Kubina joined us for part of the discussion so hopefully Vince will follow the discussion with some hard facts such as the bottom line (cost) for his ideas. We still maintain BUILD IT AND THEY WILL COME. The good news is that Beverly Sarpone has volunteered to lead the mini-golf rebuild effort with Deb Palank and Mike Kubina assisting.

The Board decided to keep the 2015 golf rates going into 2016. The GM is talking to a past Alpine Lake Golf Pro and current property owner about serving as the golf pro, mentoring our young golf assistants and assisting in procuring a more permanent seasoned golf pro for Alpine Lake. This is a challenging concept but one that we hope works to our benefit.

We also look forward to working with the community on Alpine Lake's Whoville project for the 2016 winter season. We have to file a plan to use the Whoville theme since it is copyright protected; so we are holding our second brainstorming session at the Lodge for employees and property owners on January 21st at 10am. Please join us for this fun project that we hope will become an Alpine tradition.

The Board approved the following guidelines for the pool. Property owners may purchase 2 pool access cards at \$5 each and an additional 2 cards at \$10 each. Lost card replacements will cost \$10 each. The access cards are renewable yearly on 1st May. Employees are entitled to one access card at \$5 and must be present when the card is used. Employees' families consist of spouse or significant other, children and grandchildren. This amenity use is subject to continuous review. Balancing the pool chemicals is a work in progress at this point. Once we have reached the preferred balance, we will schedule the health and fire inspections and the grand opening will follow. Hold onto your hats for the big announcement.

We do not hold member meetings during the months of December, January and February, resuming those in March. Our workshops, however, are open for property owners and will be January 23rd at 10am (because our agenda was so long on January 16th we adjourned and decided to cover the remaining agenda this week) and February 27th at 10am. Join us so you know what is going on.
