FRACKING IN GARRETT COUNTY BY 2017 (Excerpted article from The Republican, 5/19/16)

"Scientists find evidence that deep water injections can pollute ground water." That is the headline of a story released last week and appearing—of all places—on the Shale/Gas International website. The scientists conducting the studies are not representatives of any anti-fracking organizations. The two studies were conducted by scientists from the U.S. Geological Survey, the University of Missouri, and Duke University, near an underground injection site near Fayetteville, WV.

The studies are the first to demonstrate negative water-quality impacts to a surface stream due to activities at a fracking injection disposal site. So, despite the injection of this highly toxic liquid thousands of feet below the surface of the earth, this study produced evidence that the liquid ultimately makes its way back toward the surface threatening surface waterways—streams, rivers, lakes, ponds, etc.

Water and sediment samples collected both upstream and downstream from the disposal site showed evidence of elevated elements, such as sodium, chloride, strontium, lithium and radium, all of which are contaminants of varying degrees of toxicity. Not only does contamination make water unsafe for human consumption, it also threatens the various forms of aquatic life and thus the ecosystem food chain in general.

According to the EPA, more than 36,000 of these wastewater disposal wells are now operating in the US. "Considering how many wastewater disposal wells are in operation across the county, it's critical to know what impacts they may have on the surrounding environment," said Duke University scientist Christopher Kassotis, the lead author on one of the studies.

The state of Maryland is barging right ahead with establishing regulations to bring this devastating industry into our Garret County backyards and playgrounds by October 2017.

Someday the rain will stop and the sun will shine on Alpine Lake. We are all waiting patiently and keeping busy at the same time.

If you have been at the boathouse lately you've noticed the new posts have been set for the railing. The cable will follow probably this week if the weather holds.

We have rescheduled Community Pride Day for June 11th.

We are asking all committee chairpersons to submit your yearly report to the IGM for the annual meeting by 17th June. Please limit your report to highlights in no more than 500 words and include financial information as appropriate.

The Board approved the Lake Management Committee boat rentals proposal, pending insurance liability and legal reviews. The rental proposal included 2 adult and 2 youth kayaks with paddles and appropriate personal flotation devices (PFD). The kayaks will be locked at the boatyard and guests will be able to rent them at the Front Desk. Property owners who have good kayaks they are no longer using can donate them to the Lake Management Committee for rental purposes.
