This is a solicitation much like ones we have all received in regard to our power service, washing machine, etc. Please note that the bottom line of the letter in fine print states “independent company, separate from your local utility or community”. Although the business return envelope bears a Charleston, WV address, the company is from **Connecticut**, and a representative of the contract issuer which is AMT Warranty Corp. from **New York**. ***I want to stress that this service is, in no way, solicited by or associated with ALPUC.*** I would further recommend that, prior to signing up for any warranty service on any item or service you have, to do full research on each of the represented companies, before you make any decisions.
