Thank you to all pool/fitness room users for your patience and understanding during the time the area was closed for deck repainting. Work on low areas where water "pools" was done and the epoxy paint that was applied should eliminate any flaking or peeling. During this same period of time, the staff was able to replace cracked pads on the fitness equipment and install a TV in the fitness area. Jeff Delaney (Lodge Maintenance), Shane Livengood, (Recreation Coordinator), and Fred Isennock (Property Owner) completed this project ahead of schedule.

Several other budgeted projects have been brought up for discussion: completion of the exterior walls in the pool area, replacing the incline platform lift in the lobby, and improvements to effectively utilize the third floor rooms. As of this issue date, the PH and Chlorine levels have been stabilized in the pool; the water, however, is still cloudy. We cannot open the pool until the water is clear enough to see all drains on the pool floor. I remind everyone again to sign in when using the pool and shower before entering the water. Please do not bring food or drinks (other than water) into the pool area. The staff works very hard to keep this amenity tidy and operational but needs your cooperation. Please obey the signs on the Fitness Center doors that state that no one under the age of 16 is permitted without an adult. Also, please do not enter the Fitness Center dripping wet from the pool. The staff and I want these areas to be a place for all to enjoy, and request that everyone be mindful of these rules.

I'm excited to announce a new convenience to Property Owners! Gregg's Pharmacy will now be offering home delivery service for prescriptions or any other item they carry, once a week on Wednesdays, to the Lodge. They will arrive at 3:30pm and stay onsite for 20 minutes for residents to pick up their prescriptions. There will be a \$3 delivery fee, and you must have a charge account set-up with the Pharmacy or provided them with your credit card information.
