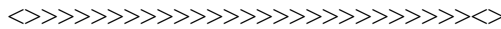

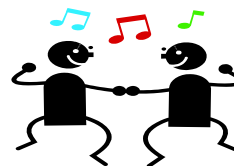

**Repeating article in case you missed it last issue:** Fall is here and now is the time to check your gutters for debris before the leaves accumulate. It might also be the time to consider gutter guards to help maintain a water flow from the roof.

Some of the snowbirds are already packing to head to distant lands. We have had two instances over the past winter where snow piling up against door-frames has caused leakage and internal damage. It might be a good idea to have someone check on your house while you're away, to clear at least some of the snow away from the doors.

With the leaves falling, it is probably a good time to assess the trees on your property for damage. Trees can be trimmed without a permit, but make **sure** that whoever does the work on your property is insured. As a homeowner, you could be liable if an accident occurs. As always, a permit is needed to remove any tree over five inches in diameter. This is a “no-fee” permit. If you have any questions, please contact a member of the committee.
