Some great musicians will entertain everyone who comes to listen.

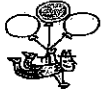

ALP CRELLIN SCHOOL TOUR REPORT – *by Cynthia Lincoln*

The ALP 2015 summer season Crellin field trip opened to resounding applause by 35 attendees on Tue., June 2nd (pun intended). Several vehicles sojourned to Crellin School in Garrett County and were greeted like honored guests at the entrance by smiling student hosts and hostesses. The program launched with a concert performance of 3 numbers by the Crellin Rhythm & Rubbish Band, and an inspiring song by the school chorus. This set the tone for a positive and enthusiastic tour in which the misty drizzle did not dampen our spirits. The individualized 5 tour groups meandered through the various outdoor learning centers, accompanied by at least 3 tour guides per group. We experienced the animal science studies at the two barns, the horticultural program in the new greenhouse, vegetable garden, a gated mini tree farm, aquatic research and developments in the wetlands with a boardwalk made from recycled milk jugs, rescued creek habitat, as well as the ornithological studies afforded by the bird conservatory and bird houses scattered throughout the grounds.

In addition, we learned about the history of this former “double boom” town, which included coal and lumber industries. There were artifacts around the grounds, including a piece of the former rail, the original coal tipple, and a playground replica of the double boom town, among other historic landmarks. We ended a full morning by noon with a send-off by a gathering of smiling, waving students lining the exit from this little gem of a public school in our adjoining Appalachian backyard. The follow-up correspondence from our host Principal Dr. Dana McCauley sums it up best – “It was a great day.” Please stay tuned for upcoming select ALP offerings this summer season. Don’t miss an opportunity to enjoy these presentations, made possible primarily through volunteer presenters and efforts.

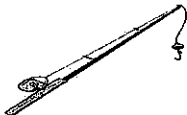

It's June and the summer season kicked off with nice weather and a lot of visitors over the long Memorial Day weekend. It was great seeing everyone enjoying the lake. Hopefully it is a good sign for the rest of the summer.

The board is as impatient as all of you to see completed projects. The new front doors were ordered the first of March with a 6-8 week delivery time, and still have not shipped. We had hoped to have them installed before the annual meeting. The deep end of the old pool is now filled and a new concrete floor fills that space. They are finishing the insulation and installing the HVAC system, next followed by the dividing wall.

We will have removed the old security building and repositioned the entry flower garden area, hopefully completing this before the annual meeting. Not only is this a better first impression for our community, but safer office space for our Security staff. The new test cameras have been installed in select locations within the community. We hope this test gives us a better idea of the monitoring capability of this model of camera and the best possible locations for installation. Please remind your visitors that they may be on "Candid Camera".

We have approved the WVU environmental study of the lake. Tom Kinsey, Lake Management Chair, will be working with Dr. Leslie Hopkinson to finalize the plans. Security has been reminded to deny entry to contractors, delivery persons and guests that have not been previously authorized; however, in the event a homeowner forgets to notify Security ahead of time, they will receive a courtesy call to verify that someone at the gate is expected and welcome. If you are expecting contractors or delivery persons, notify Security of the approximate time of arrival.

ECC COMMITTEE – by Dick Gallagher, Chair

Most homeowners are back from their winter escapes, and many are contemplating having work done on their homes. As a general rule, if it's on the outside, you probably need a permit, with the exception of general landscaping. Also, all contract work done with a value of over \$2,500 must be done by a licensed WV contractor. Owners should request a copy of the license, along with proof of insurance, before signing any contract. Be certain that the contractor's license covers the work to be done (i.e. an electrical contractor's license is not valid for plumbing work). Driveway paving/repaving requires a permit and at least two weeks' notice, as the work must be coordinated with the roads crew.

Remember, your property's condition also reflects on your neighbors. Please clean up, pick up, and fix up your property! We will be turning over a list of neglected properties to the board beginning this week. Don't be on the list.

COMPLIANCE COMMITTEE – by Teddi Cox, Chair

A gentle reminder from our committee that the Alpine Lake Declaration of Restrictions states that all lots, whether occupied or unoccupied, and any improvements thereon will be well-maintained, and no unattractive growth or accumulation of rubbish or debris will be permitted. Several property owners have approached members of the CC to complain about a neighbor's need to clean their yard. The CC cannot act unless an Allegation of Violation form is completed and submitted. The person(s) making the allegation must provide evidence of the violation and be willing to testify at a hearing. No one likes to file against a neighbor; no one likes to be accused and the CC does not like to spend Saturday mornings in a hearing. Let's all keep our properties neat, without the need for intervention.
