Alpine Lake Public Utilities Company is pleased to introduce ONLINE BILL PAY! You will now be able to view your ALPUC bill and your usage history online. You will also have the option and capability to pay your bill online; however, if you choose to pay online there are transaction fees associated with the service, these are **NOT** ALPUC fees. The fees for using this service go to the third party company that processes the payments. We have added this feature for the convenience of our customers as we still have several options for payment.

The fees for paying online will be as follows:

Visa, MasterCard or Discover Credit Cards - \$6.45

Visa or MasterCard Debit Cards - \$2.45

Electronic Checks (e-checks) - \$1.50

Prior to being able to log in and utilize the service, please refer to the top right corner of your bill where you will find your book and account number and a 6-digit generated pin number. Your book, account and pin number are a unique set of numbers tied to your ALPUC account that will allow you online access. Please email us at alpucoffice@frontier.com and verify that all your contact information is current and up to date prior to utilizing the service. It is very important to have a valid email on file. Please always refer to your billing statement for this information or email the office for assistance at alpucoffice@frontier.com.

ALPOA BOARD NEWS

BOARD NEWS submitted by Barbara Conway

Recently, Board News has publicized property owner concerns expressed during workshop or open board meetings. These comments are not a part of the published agenda and usually relate to community safety or aesthetics. The lack of screening around fuel tanks was a property owner topic brought up at the August 20th meeting. Discussion centered around what constitutes adequate screening, as well as community-wide monitoring to insure enforcement of this requirement. ECC has made tank-screening requirements a point of emphasis in the recent past, but screening still remains a concern to Alpine residents.

A reminder to all: SECTION 8. GENERAL PROHIBITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS, A. (i) Every fuel storage tank shall be buried below the surface of the ground or screened by fencing or shrubbery to the satisfaction of the Committee. Every outdoor receptacle for ashes, trash, rubbish or garbage shall be installed underground, screened or so placed and kept as not to be visible from any street, lake or recreation area.

Please ensure that you have followed the requirements as stated in the Declaration of Restrictions. If you have any questions related to screening, the ECC will be glad to discuss them. Thank you.
