We have something very special going on here at Alpine. Having attended several other open mics, I can honestly say ours is unique. Our open mic has a real sense of community. Of course, we encourage and welcome visitors, vacationers, and renters to join in as either audience or performers, but the backbone of the event is the group of regulars. And our regulars are our neighbors! When I started open mic, I wanted to avoid some of the problems I saw at other open mics. I've seen lack of structure, competitiveness that was intimidating, special treatment, "hogging the mic", and lack of acceptance and respect for players at ALL levels of skill. I hope that mission was accomplished.

Our open mic has really grown. This year we had 30 different performers on a variety of instruments. We saw people get together to form duos and trios, and even groups. Some nights we had so many we only got one round in. Our crowds grew also. Our lowest night was 13 – just last week, but we rebounded to 58 this week. We had many nights in the 70s, a few in the 90s, and a couple over 100. Our record was one July night with 130! I realize how good that is for business, but for me as a musician, what was most rewarding was not the number at the peak of the dinner time, but the number who stayed until the end – for the music.

I'm grateful for the opportunity to host open mic and thank all of the brave players and patrons who support this event. SECURITY NEWS – by Ralph Hauger, Director of Security

Greetings one and all. I would like to talk about walking and bicycling safely on our roadways. When walking along roadways, it is always best to walk against the flow of traffic (facing oncoming vehicles), as opposed to walking with the flow of traffic. This enables you to see vehicles approaching, and you have a better chance to make a quick decision to move over quickly, should you need to. Bicycling has rules similar to driving an automobile. For instance, when biking, you want to travel with the flow of traffic instead of against, and ride as far to the right as you are able to.

I encourage everyone bicycling to wear a helmet – it could save your life. Also, when walking or bicycling, always wear some type of reflective gear, especially if you are out at dusk. Drivers have the responsibility to be aware of pedestrians and cyclists and to drive slowly when approaching them. Be safe out there and take care of yourself. Hello Property Owners,

The golf committee has submitted a proposal to the ALPOA Board of Directors to name the Alpine Lake golf course "Buck's Run at Alpine Lake". This proposal is part of the golf committee's major marketing campaign locally and in close major metropolitan areas such as Baltimore, Washington DC and Pittsburgh to increase golf membership and possibly encourage home ownership at Alpine Lake.

The golf committee strongly believes that the Alpine Lake golf course deserves a distinction of its own and are proposing "rebranding the course by naming it. Rebranding articulates to golfers that there is a transformation at Alpine Lake.

The Board of Directors is soliciting property owner votes and comments on this naming convention. Assigning a name will not change assessments. Comments Against:

- ✓ By naming the course it could be assumed that Alpine has opened a second course leading to confusion.
- ✓ Promoting what we have will produce a better return than promoting a name—a name that people are unfamiliar with.
- ✓ Not in favor of the suggested name "Buck's Run at Alpine Lake"
- ✓ We believe there are far more immediate issues that need to be addressed before launching "Buck's Run at Alpine Lake". What is the point of bringing in large groups to a beautiful golf course when our current amenities are suffering from neglect?
